With 72+ million, Expo 2010 in Shanghai was the largest single nation-to-nation exhibit and tourism event in recorded human history. Expo 2020 will be held in Dubai Expos are substantial opportunities to create dialogues with other countries on the issues that are common across the globe and develop creative solutions to the world's problems. |
| Can Canada afford an Expo? | EXPO2025 is an opportunity to leverage existing infrastructure projects into a world-class waterfront destination with a modest incremental spend. Member nations fully fund their own pavilions Infrastructure investment will result in significant value uplift for Port Lands, the vast majority of which is publicly owned Would create 190,000 new jobs \$15.5 new value added to the GDP Over 40 million visitors over 6 months |
| Will Expo be disruptive to our communities? | Construction of the pavilions and the Expo site would take place solely on the Port Lands. The Port Lands is located outside of the downtown core and does not run through a traffic artery. Expo takes place over 6 months and not 2 weeks, spreading out the traffic. Transit infrastructure that is planned for this area would allow for visitors to access the Port Lands. |
